**ACTC 2022-2023 for Badminton**

**Minutes of ACTC meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> March, 2022: Badminton Association of India (BAI)**

A meeting to finalize the Annual Calendar for Training and Competition (ACTC) for Badminton for the year 2022-23 was held on 30<sup>th</sup> March 2022 at 04.00 PM under the Chairmanship of Smt. Sujata Chaturvedi, Secretary (Sports) MYA&S at the Conference Hall, Sports Authority of India HQ, New Delhi. The list of participants is annexed.

2. At the outset, Secretary General, BAI listed the projected targets for Badminton including Asian & Commonwealth Games 2022, and submitted the following measurable outcomes:

3. BAI presented the plans for the National Coaching Camps and Foreign Exposures for events leading to Asian Games 2022 in September. The budget summary was presented thereafter in accordance with the revised norms for funding under Scheme of Assistance to NSF.

4. In accordance with the minutes of ACTC held on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2021, a brief review was undertaken of the commitments made in ACTC 2021-22, as follows:

- 4.1 National coaching camps are being conducted by BAI based on the medal probability for the upcoming Commonwealth Games, 2022 and Asian Games, and Olympics 2024 in targeted events. Establishment of National Centres of Excellence (NCOEs) and final selection of the TOPS Development Group yet to be completed by BAI.
- 4.2 Selection policy for selection of athletes for participation in the Foreign Exposures/International Competitions through the ACTC beyond the Top 25 World Ranked athletes in that event so as to increase access to more athletes to compete in higher grade tournaments and improve their world ranking yet to be completed by BAI. Further Selection policy for selecting the players for Commonwealth and Asian Games 2022, is yet to be put up on the BAI website.
- 4.3 To put forth a systematic training and competition plan for the Core and Development athletes as well as the other national campers up to Asian Games 2022 and beyond till Olympics 2024 along with periodization with an indication of their peak events yet to be completed by BAI.

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5. Secretary General, BAI made the following commitments, which were included as binding decisions as a part of approved ACTC calendar and budget:

- 5.1 Final selection of national campers and introduction of structured & targeted programme for juniors including support for those beyond the top 25 World Ranked athletes would be completed by end of April 2022.
- 5.2 More focussed and targeted Junior Development Programme with ratio for expenditure for Senior and Junior age groups as presented in the ACTC proposal.
- 5.3 Categorization of athletes for foreign exposures.
- 5.4 Gender Budgeting to be done so as to ensure equal expenditure for Men and Women.
- 5.5 Strengthening and capacity building in National Camps through inclusion of Sports Science Staff and ensuring scientific evaluation of campers and targeted interventions thereof. Data management of performance evaluation be ensured.
- 5.6 Maintaining a proper system of utilisation of government grants under the scheme.
- 5.7 Displaying of grants received through the scheme on website of BAI.
- 5.8 Strict compliance of WADA Code and NADA rules, details of educational plans for athletes and display of Anti-Doping awareness programmes on their respective websites.
- 5.9 Partnership for various programs under Khelo India.
- 5.10 Planning and implementation of coach development programme under HRDS.

6. The calendar and budget were considered and approved with modifications pursuant to deliberations. The total budget for the ACTC was approved for BAI up to March, 2023 with a cap of **Rs. 24. Crores**; of this 10% is earmarked for contingencies and 3% for administrative expenses of the NSF as per norms dated of MYAS dated 28<sup>th</sup> February 2022. It is emphasized that NSF will allocate adequate budget as demanded for Asian Games & Commonwealth Games 2022 & ensure that all the needs of athletes as projected under ACTC is fulfilled.

7. The budget is approved along with calendar placed at **Annexure** for the following requirements:

**7.1 National Coaching Camp (Senior)**

A limit of maximum of 300 camp days in a year for seniors shall be adhered to. *Placed at Annexure-I.1*

**7.2 National Coaching Camp (Junior)**

A limit of 60 camp days in a year for juniors shall be adhered to. The junior national campers shall henceforth train at the National Centres of Excellence and the campers are to be admitted in the NCOEs of their choice, as per availability. *Placed at Annexure-I.2*

**7.3 Foreign Training & Competition (Senior & Junior)**

7.3.1 Foreign Exposure in all age groups and across all events should be with a focused approach on targeted events where there are realistic medal chances and with commensurate exposures to the Junior Group. Further, limit of 90 days in a year for training and competition abroad has to be adhered to. *Placed at Annexure- II-III*



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7.3.2 BAI to ensure that athletes across all age groups and events shall participate in different international competitions as per the level of the competition to maximise exposure. The final players/team will be decided based on the analysis of the current national and international performance of the players.

**7.4 Remuneration- Indian Coaches & Support Staff**

The names and salaries of the coaches and support staff to be empanelled for the National Coaching Camp shall be approved separately by the Empanelment Committee **by 30.04.2022**. Placed at Annexure-IV.

**7.5 Remuneration- Foreign Coaches & Support Staff**

The overall expenditure of foreign coaches & support staff not to exceed 30% of the total budget sanctioned under ACTC. Placed at Annexure- V.

**7.6 Equipment (Consumables & Non-Consumables)**

The NSF to procure equipment as per circular of MYAS. Placed at Annexure-VI.

**7.7 Domestic Competitions**

Placed at Annexure- VII.

8. The proposed ACTC is approved within the approved budgetary ceiling as stated at Para 6 above. A review would be undertaken after Asian Games 2022, in the month of October 2022, based on the achievements of Asian Games 2022 and targeted preparation for Olympics 2024, for any additional requirement of funds subject to availability of budget under the 'Scheme of Assistance to NSF'.

9. Modifications to the calendar can be made by NSF with the approval by DG SAI within the overall approved budget. It is reiterated that all the guidelines mentioned in MYAS circular dated 28<sup>th</sup> Feb 2022 will be adhered to.

10. Secretary (Sports) emphasised on the following aspects:

- a. BAI should closely monitor Asian Games & Commonwealth Games preparation & ensure that all needs of the medal probable athletes are fulfilled.
- b. BAI should work on building up the bench strength to ensure larger pool of players make it to the top 50 BWF ranking. Adequate competition exposure to second level players to be ensured for the same. A deeper selection process to be initiated for selection of upcoming players.
- c. BAI should prepare the roadmap to Olympics 2024 with detailed training plan. BAI should also make complete plan for excellence in 2028 & 2032 Olympics which includes strengthening junior development programme under TOPS NCOE, strengthening domestic competition structure in lines with best practices in the world, coach development plan to reduce reliance on foreign coaches, referees'/judges' development, athlete education, grass root development plan, etc. Complete plan may be submitted by **15<sup>th</sup> April 2022**, post which separate discussion would be held.



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- d. BAI shall include scientific sports staff such as strength & conditioning experts, doctors, nutritionists, physiologists etc. in the national coaching camp to strengthen the coaching camp and enhancing the performance of the players at international level.
- e. BAI shall also ensure regular dope testing of the players in the national coaching camps as well as competitions to make Badminton a dope free sport.
- f. BAI shall conduct regular athlete education programmes/awareness programmes to educate the Badminton players on doping awareness.
- g. BAI should conduct grassroot training program for PE teachers & other trainers under e-Khel Pathshala program. It was agreed that the BAI would provide all support for development of modules for the programme & monitor implementation.
- h. Alternate training and competition plans should be prepared to cater for any possible further outbreaks of COVID-19. Also, strict protocols should be put in place to avoid COVID-19 infections during training.
- i. Training and competitions for athletes should cater for adequate recovery and peaking at the right time to ensure maximum medal probability.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
