The 2013 IBL will feature six franchises and will run for 18 days. Each franchise will host a twoday leg and the League will showcase a grand total of 90 matches.

The top four franchises in the League will clash in the semifinals and the winners will meet in the grand finale on August 31, which will be played in Mumbai.
